PLAY THERAPY 1: THE THERAPEUTIC POWER OF PLAY, NOVEMBER 1-2, 2021

You will receive an understanding of play therapy foundations, the intake and assessment process and how to set up a playroom. You will learn to establish rapport with the child and parents, directive versus non-directive approaches, as well as learn about attachments in play therapy. This introductory course is for mental health therapists, psychologists, clinical social workers, family therapists, school counsellors, and child care workers working with children and youth between 3-17 years old.

PLAY THERAPY 2: THE THERAPEUTIC POWER OF PLAY NOVEMBER 3-4, 2021

This course builds on Play Therapy 1. You will learn how to effectively recommend play therapy to caregivers, how to conduct sessions, and how to recognize themes. Through five teaching modalities; didactic material, video demonstrations, live demonstrations, case studies, and experiential role-plays; the learner will experience how to adapt play therapy for young children and adolescents, and how to overcome resistance and manage aggression in the playroom.

Announcing: CAPT Research Award for Active Research in Play Therapy

PURPOSE: The mission of CAPT is to promote the value of play, play therapy and Certified Play Therapists in Canada.

CAPT will award one research grant of \$1,000 to a project involving current research in the area of play and play therapy for 2022. The Award is approved by an Ethics Board.

Applications must be received by CAPT no later than November 19, 2021 and the study or a report of the study is to be completed and submitted by September 1, 2022.

A decision regarding grant applications will be made by the Research Committee by December 30, 2021.

CPTs, CPT-s' and PTI's are required to obtain 12 hours of continuing education every year in order to maintain certification with CAPT. This continuing education must be related to the theory and practice of child psychotherapy/play therapy.

It is important for you to remember that 4 hours of the 12 have to be CAPT sponsored training. This can include CAPT annual conference, CAPT Approved Provider training as well as CAPT training. CEU is calculated as 1 CEU per hour of training.

As part of your membership with CAPT, you have access to all the **International Journal to Play Therapy** (IJPT) for over 25 years. These articles are peer reviewed so they are the best of the best. Here are some of the latest and greatest. Enjoy. **Online Access to APA journals**: If you are not a member of the American Psychological Association or do not have a current account with the APA, go to <u>https://my.apa.org</u> and click on "Create an Account" and enter the email address you used to sign up with CAPT as your user name and create a password.

The password will need to be 8-14 characters long, with a mix of letters, numbers or symbols. If you are a member of the American Psychological Association or if you already have an established login account with the APA, go to <u>https://my.apa.org</u> and login with your current user name and password. Once you're logged on, scroll down to the area designated as "Subscriptions."

Under Subscriptions scroll down to the section "Journals," where *your journal* is listed, then click on your journal to view it. From here you can view the citation and full text of any article published in the journal. Please note that you will be able to browse all of the journals in APA's PsycARTICLES database; however, you will have access to the full text of only those to which you subscribe.
