The Canadian Association for Play Therapy (CAPT) calls for Foundation Play Therapy Instructors to submit proposals to be included on the Canadian Association for Play Therapy, Instructors Roster for 2023. This Roster holds the names of those instructors who are experts in Canada in topics and modalities specific play therapy taught in CAPT annual Foundation Play Therapy Training Days over the period of a year.

The application is measured through the quality of the instructor credentials, and experience in the subject matter and in this time, relating to experience using a Learning Management System and/or Zoom on-line.

The following topics are being considered for the 2023 year. The training would take the form of a 1 or 2 day training as indicated below:

REQUIRED TOPICS

- Play Therapy History, Models and Process (2 days)
- Treating Disruptive Behaviour Problems in a Play Therapy Setting (2 days)
- Vicarious Trauma and Self Care (1 day)
- Play Therapy Assessment and Treatment Planning (1 day)
- Proposals to be a back up instructor for any Foundation Play Therapy Training topic expertise.

The Proposal must meet the following requirements:

- CAPT Approved Provider Guidelines: It is essential to abide by the CAPT Approved Provider guidelines on the CAPT website. <u>Click Here</u> to access this document.
- 2. **Biography:** A short (400 words maximum) biography outlining background, education/designations specific to the topic, experience with the topic, teaching experience (including on-line instruction and how you would work independently on Zoom/Breakouts/Chat etc.), and work in clinical practice.
- 3. Name

- 6. **Telephone #:** Daytime and Evening.
- 7. Title of Training Proposed.
- 8. **Overview**: (40 60 words) for promotional literature with play therapy prominently displayed.

CAPT's expectations for learning outcomes for Foundation Play Therapy Days must focus on play therapy throughout. If these are to be altered or improved upon for your training, please highlight where you propose changes or additions. The use of Blooms taxonomy is required.
- 10. **Teaching Methods:** (How you will organize your time specifically relating to on-line offerings, i.e. PowerPoint, lecture, video, group discussion, experiential exercises.
- 11. **Course Content:** The workshop should be a balance of didactic lecture and experiential exercises so students can apply the material using play therapy. Describe theoretical lens and modalities being utilized/discussed/taught
- 12. **Sources:** (3-5 sources from past 5 years that your material will be based upon)
- 13. **Evaluative Questions**: that test students' knowledge of key material based on the Learning Outcomes.
- 14. CV: A full detailed curriculum vitae.
