

### CALL FOR NOMINATIONS 2023 CAPT BOARD OF DIRECTORS

#### Deadline for submission: February 28, 2023

The CAPT Board of Directors is the organization's national governing body. It comprises 15 directors who are elected and allowed to serve, if they chose, three successive two-year terms. Any current member of CAPT may stand for election to one of the 15 seats.

#### Selection Criteria:

In selecting nominees, the current Board of Directors will consider CAPT needs for national representation on the Board to be filled by persons who:

- have institutional and individual credibility at national, regional and/or international levels in the Mental Health profession and/or specifically Play Therapy;
- have experience at managerial levels and/or as a member of other boards of directors;
- possess relevant specialized knowledge or skills; or
- have demonstrated an active commitment to CAPT's mission, vision, values and programs.

The Nominations Committee will also consider CAPT's needs for a Board that collectively is:

- broadly representative of CAPT's national reach and geographic diversity;
- broadly representative of CAPT's membership composition (by Institution type, national location, etc.);
- be diverse in terms of gender, age, race, ethnicity and cultural background;
- diverse in terms of experience and skills; and,
- conducive toward maintaining an appropriate measure of continuity.
- come to the Board of Directors table with an understanding of contribution to the association.
